Is mass a liturgy?

But it's not Mass. Mass is two parts, Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist. Liturgy of the Word is the three reading and homily part and Liturgy of the Eucharist is the well eucharist part.

What is the difference between mass and Divine Liturgy?

Differences between the Mass and the Divine Liturgy reveal both a common spiritual source and distinctive developments in worship over time and space. Yet the churches of the West and the East both witness to the desire to worship God "in spirit and truth," participating in the one sacrifice of Christ by which we are fed and redeemed.

What is a liturgy of the word?

In the newer, post-conciliar form of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word is the first half of the Mass (the second half being the Liturgy of the Eucharist.) In days of yore, this was called the Mass of the Catechumens and the Mass of the Faithful. What you're seeing here is that there is going to be what is commonly called a "communion service."

What is a Christian liturgy?

In sum, Christian liturgy consists of various liturgical rites (families of customs and texts) with many rites (individual acts of worship), the primary of which is the Mass. These rites are contained within books such as the Missal. The contrast with the eastern use of "divine liturgy" and the jurisdiction aspect of a Rite is very helpful.

Although we divide the Mass into two parts for understanding, it is a single liturgical and salvific act. The Word prepares, the Eucharist realizes; both illuminate each other.
